<u>Literacy</u>

In this term's literacy, we will be focussing of the text Escape from Pompeii by Christina Balit alongside a range of other supporting texts.

Every half term, we will be exploring a range of fiction and non-fiction text types such as diary entries, setting descriptions, newspaper articles, instructions etc.

To enhance your child's writing, <u>individual reading</u>, <u>handwriting and</u> <u>SPAG</u> sessions will continue to take place each week. Please continue to support Owl Class by completing spelling homework and reading at home.

Art and Design Technology

This half term we will continue with the whole school Art Project encompassing the four elements. Owl Class have been asked to use 'Air' as their inspiration and we will be completing pieces of work and developing skills linked to this theme.

History and Geography

We will start our new theme by looking at The Romans and their civilisation. We will then start looking at the Roman Empire and the influence it had over Britain. During this half term we will also be looking at the location of Rome and looking at the geographical aspects of the Roman Empire.

<u>Computing</u>

Your child will have focussed Computing lessons each term. This half term's focus will be on 'programming'. The children will still have access to the site purple mash where they can practise their programming skills. Passwords can be found in reading diaries.

Across all areas of the curriculum, we will be using the internet for research in order to develop digital literacy skills.
