<u>Literacy</u>

In this term's literacy, we will be reading the book Beowulf, by Michael Morpurgo, an ancient story about the triumphs of good over evil. We will be using this text and our scheme of learning to inspire our writing this term.

Every half term, we will be exploring a range of fiction and non-fiction text types such as diary entries, setting descriptions, newspaper articles, instructions etc.

To enhance your child's writing, <u>individual reading</u>, <u>handwriting and</u> <u>SPAG</u> sessions will continue to take place each week. Please continue to support Owl Class by completing spelling homework and reading at home.

Art and Design Technology

This half term we will be carrying out an Art project looking at the formal elements of Art and developing a range of skills such as working with shapes, a range of materials and adding light and shade to our drawing.

History and Geography

This half term will be focussed on the Anglo Saxons and Scots. We will be focussing on chronology and gaining an understanding of their place in the history of Britain. The scheme of work will look at important people from that time period, settlements, battles and the lasting impact on Britain today.

Although Geography is not being covered separately this half term aspects of our History work will look at maps and the settlements created.

<u>Science</u>

This half term, Owl class will work with Miss Matich every Wednesday morning for their weekly science lessons.

They will start by looking at electricity where they will have the opportunity to create circuits, learn key vocabulary and take part in experiments to discover the various roles of components within a circuit.

<u>Computing</u>

Your child will have focussed Computing lessons each term. This term, Miss Matich will work with Owl class for their computing lessons. This half term's focus will be on digital devices and networks. The children will still have access to the site purple mash where they can practise their programming skills. Passwords can be found in reading diaries.

During topic lessons, we will be using the internet for research in order to develop digital literacy skills.



<u>Homework</u>

<u>Reading</u>

Please hear your child read and record this in your child's diary. This can be a school reading book, an online reading book or a reading material of your choice at home. Weekly comprehension will also be set to support the work we are doing in class.

<u>Music</u>

In music the Owls will be looking at how music can support the telling of a story. They will start by looking at a piece of music and thinking about the story it creates before moving on to compose their own melody to accompany a story.
